



Bobby Clark
Head Men's Soccer Coach
University of Notre Dame

In January of 2001 at the University of Notre Dame, the Bobby Clark era of Fighting Irish soccer officially began. Clark, who built the Stanford University program into one of the nation's elite, amassed a 71-21-12 record over five seasons down on "the Farm", including four NCAA tournament appearances and a 2nd place finish in 1998.

Prior to arriving at Stanford, Clark compiled an impressive group of experiences both as a coach and a player. From 1994-96, Clark served as the head coach for the national team of New Zealand, producing a 21-12-3 record while working with the nation's Senior, Olympic, U-20 and U-17 squads.

Clark began his collegiate coaching career at Dartmouth College. In nine seasons he led the Big Green to three Ivy League titles and a pair of NCAA quarterfinal appearances. Clark's Dartmouth teams were ranked in the top 10 for four consecutive seasons and he was twice named NSCAA Regional Coach of the Year.

Clark also has coached in Africa and in his native Scotland. In Zimbabwe, he was the director of coaching with the Bulawayo Highlanders in the Zimbabwean Super League for the 1983-84 season. In Scotland, he was the youth coach for Aberdeen FC of the Scottish Premier League. Aberdeen FC was also the club where Clark spent 17 years as a professional player in the Scottish League. Representing Scotland as a national team player at every level, Clark also played in three World Cup campaigns. The 1978 Scotland squad advanced to the World Cup Finals in Argentina.



Brian Wiese
Assistant Men's Coach
University of Notre Dame

After five years as an assistant coach under Bobby Clark at Stanford, Brian Wiese has made the move to join the Irish soccer staff. Wiese's relationship with Clark dates back even further than the Stanford period as Wiese started in the goal at Dartmouth College under then Dartmouth coach Clark. While at Dartmouth Wiese was a three-time All-Ivy League selection, and his stint with Bulawayo Highlanders of Africa adds professional playing experience to his already impressive credentials.

At Stanford Wiese developed one of the nation's top defenses. The 1998 Cardinal squad, for example, rode the play of the back line and goalkeeper to the NCAA Championship match and a final #2 national ranking while surrendering just 15 goals in 25 games, good enough for 4th best in the country (0.56 GAA). Wiese's work with the Cardinal goalkeepers in particular has the Irish netminders anxiously awaiting the 2001 season.



Mike Avery
Assistant Men's Coach
University of Notre Dame

The lone returning member to the coaching staff from the 2000 season, Mike Avery has been called on by Coach Clark to help ease the transition into his new position with the Irish. Avery's experiences at Notre Dame, as well as in his previous head coaching roles should provide Clark with another valuable resource as his tenure with the Irish gets underway.

Prior to coming to Notre Dame, Avery gained head college coaching experience at Cal State San Bernardino (NCAA DII) and Bethel College (NAIA) by serving as the head coach for the men's and women's teams at each institution. Avery's Bethel men's team earned two MCC Championships and a #1 regular season national ranking, while posting a school record 18 wins to only 4 losses in 1996, his third and final season with the Pilots.

SITE:

The setting for the Notre Dame Summer Boys Soccer Camp is the nationally renowned campus of the University of Notre Dame, located on the outskirts of South Bend, Indiana, 90 miles east of Chicago on the Indiana Toll Road. All campers will reside in one of the residence halls normally occupied by undergraduate students of the University. Meals will be served in the North Dining Hall. Many of the nation's finest athletic facilities will be utilized during each camp session.

APPLICATION PROCEDURES:

All prospective campers must submit the completed application portion of this brochure. Applications will be processed on a first-come, first-served basis until all sessions are filled. Acceptance of a camper will be verified upon receipt of the camp confirmation packet.

If a camp has been filled prior to the receipt of a camper's application, the camp office will offer you the opportunity to have the application held on a waiting list if desired. If the application cannot be accepted for any reason, the application and camp fee will be returned by mail.

REFUND PROCEDURES

If an accepted application is withdrawn for any reason up to two weeks prior to the start of the camp session, you will receive a refund less a \$50 per session administrative fee. If notification of withdrawal occurs within the two weeks prior to the start of the camp session, you will receive a refund less a \$100 per session administrative fee. No refunds will be issued for any reason once a camp session has begun.

INSURANCE:

Accidental death and dismemberment coverage is provided according to schedule and with a maximum principal sum of \$1,000; medical expense coverage is provided with a maximum of \$50,000. Claims up to \$250 per claim are paid on the primary basis, without regard to any coverage parents might have. Claims exceeding \$250 per claim will be paid on the excess basis, meaning that family or employer group coverage must pay its maximum first. This refers to medical expenses incurred because of injury sustained during scheduled and supervised camp activities. Hernias are not covered. The contracting of illness or disease by camper is not covered under this plan. Payment for medication and/or hospitalization needed by camper as a result of illness or disease is the responsibility of the camper and his parents. Any additional coverage desired will also be the responsibility of his parents.

TRANSPORTATION:

Discount air fares are available for those needing to fly to South Bend by calling Anthony Travel, Inc., on the campus of the University at 1-800-366-3772. Identify yourself as attending the summer sports camps and save money on flights from most cities throughout the U.S. South Bend is also accessible via Amtrak and major bus lines. Notre Dame is located off the Indiana Toll Road at exit 77.
